One Life: The True Story of Sir Nicholas Winton by Barbara Winton



Sir Nicholas Winton rescued 669 children from Nazi-occupied Czechoslovakia at the **ONE LIFE** brink of World War II. Most never saw their

parents again; nearly all left behind were murdered. This is his story. In 1938, 29-year-old 'Nicky' cancelled a ski holiday and instead spent nine months masterminding a seemingly impossible plan to rescue hundreds of Jewish children and find them homes in the UK. Over 6,000 people are alive today because of his efforts. This most poignant biography illuminates Winton's extraordinary humanitarianism and inspired the film One Life, currently showing in cinemas.
